STATEMENT OF REESEARCH CONTRIBUTIONS ON OCCUAPTIONAL THERAPY PRACTICE AND EDUCATION

I was one of the first occupational therapists to earn a PhD in the interdisciplinary field of disability studies. Disability Studies' origins in critical theory, human rights, social justice, and community collaboration have guided my research, service, and teaching ever since. Building upon my expertise in qualitative and participatory methods, I completed a post-doctoral fellowship in outcomes and health services research.

These experiences enabled me to take on key roles in several cross-NIH measurement initiatives, including the NIH Toolbox, NIH PROMIS, and National Children's Studies as an early career

scientist. I infused my occupational therapy and disability justice lens into my work on these projects to ensure that issues of physical, cognitive, and sensory accessibility were included in the development process and that the voice of the consumer remained central in spite of competing priorities and research agendas.

As my independence as a researcher grew, I pursued my research passion for understanding and dismantling barriers to health, healthcare, and social participation among people with disabilities, especially those living at the intersection of disability and other marginalized statuses. Specifically, I use community-based and participatory approaches to address the occupations of health management and community participation through the development of evidence-informed peer support and mHealth interventions. Thus, my research specifically targets priority areas identified in both the Occupational Therapy Practice Framework and the AOTF research priorities.

In the past 10 years as an OT educator, I have helped instill an appreciation of research methods, into the 10 cohorts of entry-level OT students I have taught. However, my major contribution to occupational therapy education is reflected in the strong group of early career faculty and scientists that I have had the privilege of mentoring. I have served as the primary advisory or committee member to post-professional OTD and PhD students as well as post-doctoral fellows, many of whom are now early career faculty at occupational therapy programs across the United States, Canada, and Australia. These emergent leaders continue to move the profession forward by interrogating and advancing the profession's commitment to disability equity and inclusion. I am proud of how my mentees are shaping the future of the profession at the local, state, and national level.
